After the Great War...

In 1919 the people of Bleasdale, in common with other Parishes all over the country, decided to put up a War

Memorial. £125 was collected and at a meeting in April 1919 it was resolved that 'a memorial shall be erected to the men from Bleasdale who have fallen in the late war."

There was to be a carved oak altar in St Eadmer's Church with 'the names

> of the fallen inscribed either upon or alongside the altar. Quotes from the Garstang Deanery Magazine of 1919

A board with the names of those who had served and returned was hung on the wall of the new Parish Hall,

itself a memorial, in 1929.
